they learned something new. We think that's important. In 2013, AgriSafe hosted 23 webinars given by presenters from across the country, representing universities, nonprofits, and hospitals. Topics included health hazards, keeping kids safe, health literacy, worker trust in ag workplaces, and more. Our webinars reached professionals in 44 states and internationally.



AgriSafe joined five other national non-profits as a policy partner for the 2013 National Rural Health Association (NRHA) policy conference held in Washington DC on Feb 4th. AgriSafe is honored to be a partner in this conference

aimed at promoting access to health care for rural residents, workforce training and payment equity issues. Approximately 500 rural health leaders and practitioners from across the country participated in this important annual conference.



Changing the way we care for ag producers includes how we communicate health information. AgriSafe recognizes that farmers and ranchers need access to health risk assessments (HRAs) that also include occupational health risks. AgriSafe developed the first Ag HRA furnished through a web-based program. This tool will reduce health disparities and improve health outcomes by identifying modifiable health risks.

CHS pledged a three year sponsorship to the AgriSafe Network. Known as "Invest in Your Health", AgriSafe's college health program will now be expanding to new regions of the nation.


